3. FME'94

This promises to be most successful. Three speakers have been invited: Ralph Back from Abo Akademi, Fernando Meija from GEC Alsthom who will talk about the formal development of railway signalling software, and Anthony Darlison from Lloyd's Register who will talk about the formal verification of nuclear power station control software. There is some doubt about the last talk as there may be difficulties with confidentiality issues.

38 papers were selected out of 121 submitted. More than 50 of these arrived a week or more after the published deadline. Nine tutorials were offered and all were accepted. They will take place in two tracks on the first two days. Seven industrial reports were submitted and accepted.

Springer-Verlag have agreed to publish the proceedings in the LNCS series.

15 tool demonstrations have been registered; more are under negotiation and this number may well expand to 18.

4. FME '96

Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford University has been booked for 17-22 March 1996. Jim Woodcock is in the process of composing a budget.

It has been proposed that Marie-Claude Gaudel who is chairing the IFIP WG 14.3 (Foundations of System Specifications) be invited to be programme chair of FME '96, and that this should be a joint event with IFIP WG 14.3. The importance of industrial experience in the FME conferences was emphasised. It was agreed to invite Marie-Claude Gaudel to be programme chair of FME '96, and to ask her and Jim Woodcock to work together to produce a theme, bearing in mind the need to emphasise industrial experience.
